• **Amendment to the Suplimentry regulations**

The Midland Speed Championship have been added to the list of Chamopionships under Item 5.

- **Location of the course** – The course lies 3 miles north-east of Lichfield on the west side of the A38. The nearest postcode for the circuit is WS13 8EJ. What3Words – stuffing:ideals:sketches
No entry passes are required, nor will be supplied. **Please Do NOT drive through Curborough village.**
- **Paddock Parking** – Support cars and/or trailers must be parked in the paddock behind competing cars or in the camping area by the public toilets. Paddock bays are numbered. Please Park in your allocated bay only as detailed on the entry list. (The enclosed diagram will assist you. ***Paddock numbers starting with B or C are in the main paddock area, numbers starting with A are along the fence adjacent to the track near the flagpole.***)
- **Signing-on** – SIGNING ON WILL BE COMPETED IN THE PADDOCK OFFICE. The paddock office will be open from 7.30am each morning. Drivers are reminded to make themselves familiar with all official notices on the physical notice board at the paddock office before signing on.

The event secretary reserves the right to inspect any documentation so please have all relevant paperwork and licenses with you. Non-production fees will be applied.
- **Scrutineering** – SCRUTINEERING WILL BE COMPLETED IN YOUR ALLOCATED PADDOCK BAY in competition number order. Scrutineering will start at 8am.
- **Please note** – that in order to run the meeting satisfactorily, competitors must observe the following-
 - Present themselves for practice in programme order as soon as possible.
 - Be ready for competitive runs with cars etc., in the paddock.
 - Not remove competitive vehicles from the site until completion of competition, unless authorised by the Clerk of the Course.
- **Competition Numbers** – Numbering is as shown on the attached entry list. You are responsible for numbering your car before scrutineering. **Numbers will not be available on the day.** Numbers must be displayed within the site of the competition. All competitors are further reminded that it is their responsibility to display the correct number at all times and that failure to do so on shared cars will result in a discounting of both drivers' times until the error is corrected.



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- **Courses – Saturday: Two Lap Sprint (1447 metres). Sunday: Figure of Eight Sprint (1467 metres).**
- **Marking & Penalties** - All four wheels across the white line at the edges of the track – no time will be recorded. A penalty of 0.5 seconds will be added to the competitor's time if, on any lap, they dislodge the marker on the apex of the first left-hand bend (i.e., opposite the flagpole), and/or dislodge the outer markers on the Figure of 8 cross-over in either direction.
- **Running Order** – Will be as indicated on the attached entry list.
- **Drivers' Briefing** - A mandatory drivers' briefing for **ALL DRIVERS** will be held near the paddock entrance at 8:45am on **BOTH** Saturday & Sunday.
- **Practice starts at 9:15am.** We will aim for 2 practice runs before lunch and 2 timed runs after lunch (an extra practice run and/or extra timed run will be at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course, time permitting).
- **Junior Sprint Entrants.** New Competitors will be required to drive observed laps prior to the competition in order to satisfy the Clerk of the Course that they are competent to take part, subject to the following: (a) Start singly and run over the duration of the course at least 3 times. (b) A Motorsport UK licensed driver may accompany the new Competitor, subject to approval of the Clerk of the Course. (c) Observed laps are not required if the Competitor can provide the Clerk of the Course with proof of having competed as a driver in three other Motorsport UK Permitted events. **Sighting laps will commence at 9:00am.**
- **Dual Drives**, line up in number order, first driver to run at the start of each class as shown on the entry list. Second driver (7 prefix number) to go to the start area with first driver & stay in the start area until both have completed their runs.
- **Tyre Warming - TYRE WARMING is not allowed anywhere on the venue**, and PRACTICE STARTS ARE NOT PERMITTED ON THE RETURN ROAD (which is part of the paddock area), as this is adjacent a public footpath and such actions will be deemed in breach of regulation (C.1.1.5)
- **Noise Restrictions - All MSUK Permit Events must carry out a noise check on ALL competing cars to current specifications (Regulation J5.18) and noisy vehicles dealt with immediately. In addition to the "Static Test" all participating vehicles shall be monitored by a "Drive-By" noise monitoring system located at the 64-foot point along the track from the start line.**
- **Flags** – If a red flag is displayed, competitors must come to an immediate safe controlled halt and may not continue until signaled by a marshal that it is safe to do so.
- **Refreshments** – The Sprinters Rest Cafe, run by Jodie Bentley, is available on site from 9.00am.
- **Camping.** If you require overnight camping, please contact the Secretary (details below).
- **Animals** – It is a condition of admission to the circuit and car park at events that no animals are allowed within the Curborough boundaries.
- **Litter** – Please place it in the bins provided. Waste oil, please take it home.
- **Times & Results** – will be available from **Resultsman.info**.
- **Prize Presentation** – Awards presentation will take place 30 minutes after the conclusion of Sunday's meeting outside the Paddock Office.

- Engines of competing cars must not be run at high / noisy revolutions before 9.00am
- **Run-off (Saturday only)** – time permitting, there will be a class-winners run-off at the end of the event, for the Alan Payne Memorial Trophy. To qualify, at least two competitors must post a time in that class in the event. The winner of the run-off will be the competitor who makes the greatest improvement (in seconds) over their class run time.

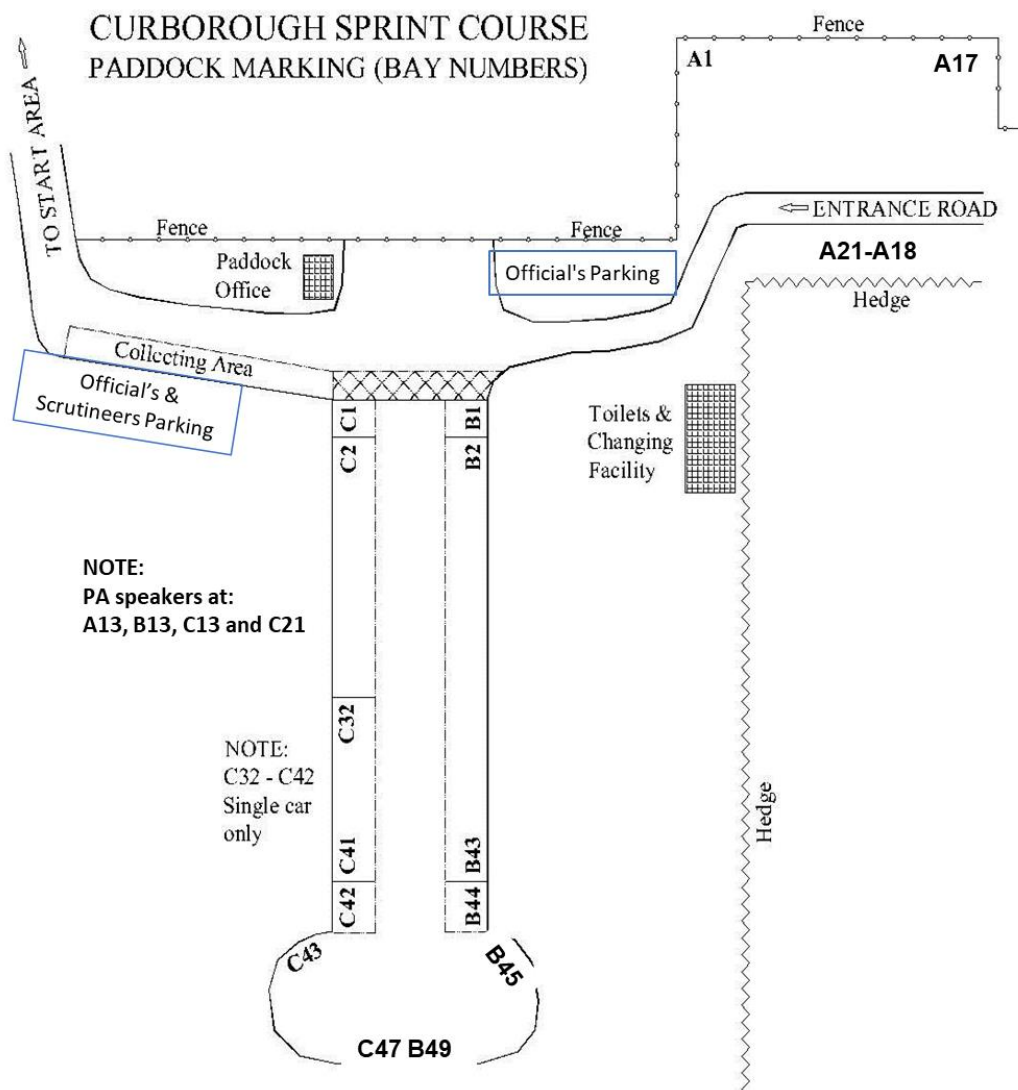
