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## moleracing 2021 – final update

*“Well, that went rather well!”*

We were sitting in a good position going into the final 6 rounds, with only Matt Hillam in the works SBD Dallara able to outscore me and for him to win the British Sprint Championship. So, my focus was all about trying to maximise the relative score between us.

### Anglesey Circuit, North Wales

After Blyton, we only had 5 days before we needed to be in the lovely circuit in North Wales, I spent about 10 hours getting the car out the trailer and thoroughly inspecting for any issues that may cause reliability at the critical weekend. Nothing was found, but some elements were stripped cleaned and rebuilt, particularly the troublesome rear left hub. So at least I felt better and set off early Friday morning to avoid traffic in the afternoon.

We had a ‘petrol panic buy’ situation in the UK and getting there was looking marginal for some competitors, especially down south. I didn’t want to potentially win the championship because my rivals couldn’t get to the event, and I managed to secure Matt and Steve’s race fuel after visiting 6 Shell garages!



Lovely weather at midday Friday and I spent an enjoyable few hours taking photos on the rocks at the beach next to the circuit. The weather however the following day was not looking anywhere near as good, and SBD let me park my car in their circuit garage overnight.

I was pleased to hear the rain start in the early hours as I like driving in the wet and had a brand new set of wet racing tyres courtesy of Telsonics continued support for 2022.

Our British class was first out of the blocks, although the start was delayed 30 mins due to the torrential conditions.

For the practice run I put a little too much faith in the new wets, which struggled to get to working temperature in the cold October weather. After an initial lock up and minor off at the top of the hill at Rocket, I got back in the groove for the rest of the lap and with downforce, 123mph in the wet on the straight was fine, stopping however for the hairpin was not! I went deep into the grass outfield, which luckily was smooth, brought it round in a big arc, got back on track and made the finish line!




So, for first timed run I had to be sensible to qualify and put in a much safer run and came 4<sup>th</sup>, with the V8 500bhp of Terrys Lola, the 750bhp of Simon Bainbridge's Sports Libre class big Turbo V8 Audi and Pete Goulding's Turbo Ecoboost (400bhp) ahead of me. So all that was needed was a sensible repeat of the next run and similar placings and not throw it off the track.

The rain continued, I made some pressure adjustments and checked the car again and we all went to the paddock holding bay ready for the launch early afternoon.

Steady as she goes, no heroics, but I still tried reasonably hard. Simon took his first ever run off win, I managed a safe 5<sup>th</sup>, but with Matt in 10<sup>th</sup>, my closest challenger couldn't now catch me, and that was it!

The very first text came in from Alan, of Triple M, who has engineered both the car and coached me this season. You know where to find him.





In anticipation of securing the national title this weekend, I had bought 30 bottle of beer and 30 individual cheese portions (I'm know for this healthy dietary combination!) and proceeded to give these to all my fellow competitors. I declined the rest of the days competition even though it was early afternoon and started on the beers! It may have been pouring with rain, but we all had a great time.

In anticipation of the championship coming down to the wire at the final round, for practice, I had entered this club event the week before – as anyone could have done, but I kept this quiet. When the entry list was published, there were cries of 'that's cheating' - I call it 'initiative'!

A nice, relaxed day, but there was a Ralt with a 600bhp Judd V8 to battle with. But I'm pleased to say I took FTD by 1 second at the end of the meeting and was in good shape for the following week.

Overall, Terry took both run off wins and Alan was second, although not registered for the run off and I took 3<sup>rd</sup>.
